

Administrative Regulation

Board of Education, Non-Voting Student Member

A. Eligibility

1. To be eligible for the position of Student Board Representative, a student must be a member of the junior or senior class (a sophomore or junior at the time of application) at a district high school when the term of office begins, and must be academically eligible (2.0 GPA).
2. Executive cabinet members (ASB president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, etc.) are ineligible to apply for the office.
3. Two students from each high school may apply for the position. Each school shall have its own method of determining the applicants.
4. Current Board Representative Committee (BRC) members are eligible for the position of Student Board Representative. The BRC is a student advisory organization which serves as liaison between schools and the Board of Education. The membership is composed of one representative from each district high school.

B. Selection

1. By interviewing all qualified applicants, the Student Board Representative shall be selected by the Intra-District Council (IDC) consisting of all the high school ASB presidents and the BRC members.
2. The Student Board Representative will be selected no later than the first week in June for the following year.
3. The Student Board Representative will serve for a period of one year - July 1 to June 30.

C. Responsibilities

1. To attend all Board of Education meetings, except closed sessions
2. To carry out the duties of a non-voting member of the Board
3. To represent student interests at Board meetings

4. To represent student proposals to the Board of Education
5. To represent the views of the BRC to the Board of Education
6. To call BRC meetings and preside over them
7. To attend all IDC and joint IDC/BRC meetings
8. To break tie votes of the BRC
9. To be responsible for a written end-of-year report of the BRC

D. Dismissal

1. The BRC/IDC has the prerogative to dismiss the Student Board Representative for not fulfilling the duties of office.
2. Dismissal shall require a majority vote of the BRC/IDC.
