

BOARD POLICY

Parental Involvement

The Board of Education recognizes that parents/guardians are their children's first and most influential teachers and that continued parental involvement in the education of children contributes greatly to student achievement, conduct, and the child's development as a responsible member of society. Parents/guardians can directly affect academic success by reinforcing their children's motivation and commitment to education. Therefore, the district shall include parent involvement strategies as a component of instructional planning to ensure optimum student success. The district's parent involvement strategies and Local Education Agency Plan shall be jointly developed with and agreed upon by parents/guardians.

School staff and parents/guardians can better understand and meet student needs if they work together. All schools have a duty to communicate frequently with the home and to help parents/guardians develop skills and family management techniques which support classroom learning. To this end, the district shall also ensure that each school develops a school level parent involvement policy. Each year, parents/guardians shall be consulted and participate in the planning, design, implementation, and evaluation of the parent involvement program.
