

Administrative Regulation

Living Wild Animals, Prohibitions Against Maintaining on Campus

Living wild animals, particularly reptiles and rodents, which are either venomous or known to be reservoirs of human pathogenic organisms, or are possibly infested with vectors of human pathogenic organisms, are not to be brought to or maintained on the school grounds or in school facilities. While it is recognized that science teachers know how to handle living wild animals in laboratory situations, the possibility of injury to students as a result of accidents, poor judgment on the part of some students, and potential vandalism make it desirable, in the interests of all persons concerned, to institute this administrative regulation.
