

BOARD POLICY

Adult Education, Tuition Fees

It is the intent of the Board of Education that adult education classes be provided at the lowest possible cost and in accordance with Education Code requirements.

The established necessary tuition fees for selected adult education classes and the available funding for adult education purposes shall not exceed the estimated cost for the maintenance of classes. Courses designated as Community Services and Forum/Lecture Series shall be funded totally from tuition fees. The superintendent or designee shall annually recommend to the Board a tuition fee schedule necessary to support all adult education classes.

With the exception of those courses designated as Community Services or Forum/Lecture Series, exemption from tuition fees shall be granted to students who at the time of enrollment are in any one of the following classifications:

- A. Elementary and/or high school courses designated for the purpose of graduation and receipt of a diploma;
- B. Adult Basic Education/English as a Second Language, Citizenship or Apprenticeship classes;
- C. Under 18 years of age and/or senior citizens 60 years of age and over as of September 1 of the fall term, or February 1 of the spring term.
