

Administrative Regulation

End-of-Year Activities, Eighth-Grade and High School Senior Class

It is the intent of the district to allow members of the eighth-grade and the high school senior graduating class to participate in special activities. All activities must adhere to existing Board policies and administrative regulations governing parent or guardian approval, transportation, supervision, and student behavior.

- A. Appropriate end-of-year class activities include, but are not limited necessarily to, the following:
1. For Seniors
 - (a) Senior Breakfast
 - (b) Prom
 - (c) Senior Awards Night
 - (d) Baccalaureate
 - (e) School-Supervised Graduation Night
 - (f) Senior Assembly
 - (g) Senior Dance/Dinner
 2. For Eighth-Grade Students
 - (a) Student Assembly
 - (b) Faculty-Student Activity
 - (c) "Dress-up" Day
 - (d) On-Campus Dance
- B. Examples of inappropriate activities applicable to all students include, but are not limited to, the following:
- (a) "Ditch Day"
 - (b) Papering and Defacing the School
 - (c) Unauthorized Access to Public and Private Property
 - (d) Scavenger Hunt

If students are engaged in inappropriate activities, the school may impose disciplinary measures as empowered by the Education Code which can include suspension, arrest, expulsion, exclusion from commencement exercises, and payment of restitution.
