BOARD POLICY

Bloodborne Pathogens, Exposure Control Plan

The district shall meet state and federal standards governing bloodborne pathogens and other potentially infectious materials in the workplace. In compliance with such regulations, the superintendent or designee shall establish a written Exposure Control Plan as prescribed by administrative regulation to protect employees from possible infection due to contact with bloodborne viruses, including human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and hepatitis B virus (HBV).
