

Administrative Regulation

Electronic Signaling Devices

A. Definition

An electronic signaling device is a device that emits an audible signal, vibrates, displays a message, or otherwise receives or communicates messages or images through the transmission or receipt of radio waves. Such devices may include, but are not limited to, cellular telephones, or any other technology designed for similar purposes.

B. Prohibitions

Students in the Garden Grove Unified School District are prohibited from using, activating, or displaying electronic signaling devices while on school grounds, while attending school-sponsored activities, or while under the supervision and control of school district employees, except when the device is necessary due to a student's medical condition or school administration approval.

Note: Student possession of laser pointers is prohibited on school property unless such possession is for a valid instructional or school-related purpose. (Penal Code Sec. 417.27)

C. Enforcement

Students found to be in violation of the policy and administrative regulation are subject to actions in accordance with prescribed school rules and district disciplinary procedures.
